AUTUMN 2022 NEWSLETTER

Planning Ahead... Building Community

For the first September since 2019, we are able to plan ahead with some degree of confidence. We are trying to get things up-and-running again to build community and to enable and encourage people to reconnect. Some things may happen easily, others might not work at all, and we will have to find new ways of doing some of the things that we did easily before the pandemic, but which now are not possible or, are no appealing to people. Our ways of keeping in contact and being able to see people have been limited and some people have been anxious about seeing people so we are looking forward to reconnecting, now that we can do so safely. COVID has not gone away and we are conscious of people suffering from long COVID but thanks to the advances with vaccines, it is becoming possible to live with COVID.

Autumn Fair

As you may see on page 4, we have installed a new heating system in St Philip and St James' Church and carried out alterations to make it more user-friendly for those who have mobility challenges. We have been fundraising for those for a number of years but obviously, we didn't have any Autumn Fairs in 2020 and 2021, or any other fundraising events, so this year's Autumn Fair is important for this project, but also, and perhaps, more importantly, it will be about community as it will be the first gathering of people in such large numbers, so we want to celebrate being able to come together, to work together and to be involved in a common project, as we met up, reconnect and spend time together.

Sunday Clubs

As you will see on page 5, we are working to re-open both of our Sunday Clubs. Sunday Club and the nurture of children in the Christian faith, whilst having fun, is a key part of parish life. We have missed not being able to have Sunday Club in our churches and look forward to having them back in action.

The Sausage Service will resume on Sunday 9th October 2022 at 6.30pm in St Philip and St James' Church and will be followed by sausages and potato wedges in the Parish Centre. Whilst these services are particularly geared towards our children and young people who play sport or do other activities on a Sunday morning, all are welcome!

HEATING and ALTERATIONS in ST PHILIP and ST JAMES' CHURCH



For many years, the Select Vestry of St Philip and St James' Church has been nurdling along the heating system. Corroding pipes, leaking radiators, a boiler house that flooded, a boiler that was ancient and was prone to not working, inadequate heating... it was quite a list! Thank you to Gordon Richards and Mike Hayes whom, time after time, went down into the bowels of the underground boiler house to evacuate rain water and to persuade the boiler to work.

The Select Vestry gave careful consideration, and took advice from experts, as to what might be the best way, economically and environmen-

tally to heat the church. We have installed a gas central heating system with radiators, with the proviso to instal an air-to-water heat exchanger once they are sufficiently developed for a building the size of St Philip and St James' Church. We installed destratifiers on the ceiling a number of years ago and these push the warm air back down. We discovered that the temperature was approximately 10 degrees higher at ceiling level than it was a mere mortal level!



As we were digging up floors, etc. we also removed some pews and dropped the floor levels to make the church more accessible for those with mobility challenges. The pews will be replaced by chairs which will give us a flexibility of seating arrangements in those areas and where people who use wheelchairs can sit with their family or friends, rather than sitting in the aisle.

We have installed running water in the church—previously the only running water was courtesy of the leaking roof before it was replaced! The next phase will be to instal kitchen facilities under the balcony on the southside so that we can have hospitality in the church, and under the balcony on the northside, we will have archival and record storage. Both of these areas under the balcony will be contained in a 'glorified cupboard' which will be aesthetically pleasing and which will screen their contents so that one will not feel that they are in a kitchen or an office during a wedding, funeral or church service.

Other phases include refurbishing the remaining pews, some work on the organ, and repainting the church. Thank you to Gordon Richards who is overseeing this work on behalf of the Select Vestry and to Justin O'Callaghan who is the architect on the project.

The photos show you something of the scale of the work that was undertaken. Thank you to those who put up with a very dusty and messy church in July, August and part of September. Come and see the finished state for yourself!!!

HEATING and SOUND SYSTEM in ST THOMAS' CHURCH

St Thomas' Church has had electric heating for years in two formats: four storage heaters and then lots of oil-filled radiators down both sides of the church. Two of storage heaters have completely stopped working and the remaining two are, at best, limping along. Due to the lovely wooden ceiling in St Thomas' Church, there is absolutely no insulation in the roof and we cannot put in any. So, we are installing two small destratifiers to push the warm air back down to human being level and we are also replacing the four storage heaters with the modern equivalent. Again, we took expert advice and this was deemed to be the most economical and best way of doing it. We hope to get started on that work shortly. It will be a simple and quick task, nothing like what had to happen in St Philip and St James' Church, and we are replacing like-with-like so no planning permission is required. The hope—depending on electricity costs— is to be toasty for the winter!

The sound system in St Thomas' Church has been struggling for a number of years; there are problems with the wiring and the amp. Thank you to Dylan Rynhart who is helping us to tease out what the exact problems are and what needs to be done to remedy them so that we do not end up spending money on things that we do not need!

THE ALICE LEAHY TRUST

TRUST, now known as THE ALICE LEAHY TRUST continues to do extraordinary work in difficult circumstances.

In our two parishes, we have an ongoing working relationship with THE ALICE LEAHY TRUST. TRUST was founded in 1975 as a private charitable trust (Charity No. CHY7014), and since then has been working with people who are homeless in Dublin. It is a non-political, nondenominational voluntary body which provides medical and related services for people who are

homeless, operating out of a premises provided at a nominal rent by the Iveagh Trust. Up to 50 men (mostly men) and women call each morning, the majority of whom are sleeping out (aged 18 to 85 years). They need the following items:

MEN'S CLOTHING

Hoodies; jeans; track-suit bottoms; jumpers; water-proof jackets; long-johns (underwear—must be new); strong, sturdy shoes (preferably runners)

THEY ALSO NEED

pot noodles (preferably chicken); pot curries (preferably chicken); cup-a-soups; mini-bars (chocolate, etc.); toiletries (shampoo, shower gel, toothpaste, toothbrushes, female hygiene products)

The items can be left at the back of either of the churches and they will then be taken into THE ALICE LEAHY TRUST.

Parishioners have been very generous over the years to THE ALICE LEAHY TRUST) and it is very much appreciated. But we would ask you to think carefully about the items that you donate; these items must be appropriate and suitable for people who are living on the streets. High-heel shoes, cocktail dresses, bikinis, etc. are all items that have been left at the back of our churches and these are NOT suitable.

Thank you to Sheila Chamberlain from St Thomas' and Viola Brady and Denise Richards from St Philip and St James' who sort the items and to Viola Brady who liaises with THE ALICE LEAHY TRUST and takes the items into them.

LENTEN 2022 CHALLENGE



Thank you to all who took part in the Lenten Challenge. As life began to open up, people were busier in Lent 2022 than they were in Lent 2021, so the number able to take up the Challenge this Lent was smaller than last year. But, thank you to those who endured some discomfort and pain at times as a few blisters made their presence known! The Rector's Challenge was to walk 6km a day for each of the 46 days of Lent, including Sundays. Thank you to those who were so encouraging, and to those who joined in on a walk on Saturday 2nd April 2022 as we walked in solidarity with Charlie Bird on his

campaign Climb with Charlie. Thank you to all who have donated so generously – it really was extraordinary. The primary aim of the Challenge was to encourage people to get back out as some were finding it hard to do so after being restricted for two years. Again, we wanted people to focus on their physical, mental,

emotional and spiritual health, and if whilst doing that, we could help others as well, that would be great. We raised a total of €6,900 which is fantastic—thank you! We were delighted to be able to give €2,300 each to The Irish Motor Neurone Disease Association, the Blackrock Hospice, and Ukrainian Relief via the Bishops' Appeal.
