confirm and strengthen you in all goodness,

and keep you in eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

<u>The Collect of the Eighteenth</u> <u>Sunday after Trinity</u>

Almighty and everlasting God: Increase in us your gift of faith that, forsaking what lies behind, we may run the way of your commandments and win the crown of everlasting joy; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**

THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

<u>The First Reading – 2 Timothy 3:</u> <u>14 – 4: 5</u>

The first reading is from the second epistle to the Timothy, chapter 3, beginning at verse 14.

¹⁴But as for you, continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it, ¹⁵and how from childhood you have known the sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. ¹⁶All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, ¹⁷so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work. 4In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I solemnly urge you: ²proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favourable or unfavourable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching. ³For the time is coming when people will not put up with sound doctrine, but having itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires, ⁴and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander away to myths. ⁵As for you, always be sober, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully.

The Holy Gospel - Mark 10: 13-16

Hear the Gospel of our Saviour Christ, according to Mark, chapter 10, beginning at verse 13. **Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

13 People were bringing little children to him in order that he might touch them; and the disciples spoke sternly to them. ¹⁴But when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them, 'Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. ¹⁵Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it.' ¹⁶And he took them up in his arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them.

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.



The Sermon

The Presentation

We welcome this child who comes to be baptized. I invite her sponsors to present her now.

Sponsors:

We present Rosie Alana Ruddock to be baptized.

Parents and godparents, will you accept the responsibilities placed upon you in bringing Rosie Alana for baptism and answer on her behalf? By your own prayers and example, by your teaching and love, will you encourage her in the life and faith of the Christian Community? *With the help of God, we will.*

In baptism this child begins her journey of faith. You speak for her today. Will you care for her and help her to take her place within the life and worship of Christ's Church? With the help of God, we will.

The Decision

In baptism, God calls us from darkness to his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore I ask:

Do you turn to Christ? *I do*.

Do you then renounce the devil and all his works? I do, by God's help.

Will you obey and serve Christ? I will, by God's help.

The priest says to the whole congregation: You have heard these our brothers and sisters respond to Christ. Will you support them in this calling?

The congregation answers: We will support them. During the singing of this hymn, the font is prepared for Rosie's baptism and her big sister Robyn pours the water into the font.

Abba Father, let me be yours, and yours alone. May my will for ever be evermore your own.

<u>The Baptism</u>

The priest, Rosie Alana, her family and godparents gather at the font and the priest begins the thanksgiving prayer.



Praise God who made heaven and earth.

Who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

[Shortened version of the Blessing of the Water]

We thank you, almighty God, for the gift of water to sustain, refresh and

cleanse all life, and we thank you for the water of baptism.

Now sanctify this water that, by the power of your Holy Spirit, she may be cleansed from sin and born again. Renewed in your image, may she walk by the light of faith and continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord; to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be all honour and glory, now and for ever. **Amen**.

The priest asks the parents and godparents: Do you believe and accept the Christian faith into which Rosie Alana is to be baptized? **I do**.

The priest addresses the whole congregation: Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess, together with these candidates the faith of the Church.

[Using a shortened version of the Apostle's Creed in question-and-answer form.]

Do you believe and trust in God the Father? I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son?


I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord. Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life. Amen.

The priest baptizes by pouring water over Rosie Alana saying:

Rosie Alana, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen.*

The priest makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of Rosie Alana, saying: Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of the cross.



Confess Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, look for his coming in glory.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. **Amen**.

The priest continues:

God has called you into his Church.

The congregation joins the priest, saying: We therefore receive and welcome you as a member with us of the body of Christ, as a child of the one heavenly Father, and as an inheritor of the kingdom of God.

Presentation of Bible and Candle

The Churchwardens, on behalf of the parish, present Rosie with a Children's Bible and a lit candle. The Bible is to help her to learn more about God and his Son Jesus Christ and to grow in her faith, and the candle symbolises the light of Christ, which has been passed down through the centuries and which is today extended to Rosie, that she may shine forth the light of Christ throughout her life.

At the end of supper you took the cup of wine, gave thanks, and said, Drink this, all of you; this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins; do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me. Lord Jesus, we bless you: you are the true vine.

Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ: dying, you destroyed our death, rising, you restored our life; Lord Jesus, come in glory.

Holy Spirit, giver of life, come upon us now; may this bread and wine be to us the body and blood of our Saviour Jesus Christ. As we eat and drink these holy gifts make us, who know our need of grace, one in Christ, our risen Lord.

Father, Son and Holy Spirit, Blessed Trinity: with your whole Church throughout the world we offer you this sacrifice of thanks and praise and lift our voice to join the song of heaven, for ever praising you and saying:

Holy, holy, holy Lord God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is he who comes in the

name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest!

Thanks be to you, our God, for your gift beyond words. *Amen. Amen. Amen.*
