The Sermon

The Presentation

We welcome this child who comes to be baptized. I invite her sponsors to present her now.

Sponsors:

We present Emilie Grace Feeney to be baptized.

Parents and godparents, will you accept the responsibilities placed upon you in bringing Emilie Grace for baptism and answer on her behalf? By your own prayers and example, by your teaching and love, will you encourage her in the life and faith of the Christian Community?

With the help of God, we will.

In baptism this child begins her journey of faith.
You speak for her today.

Will you care for her and help her to take her place within the life and worship of Christ's Church?

With the help of God, we will.

The Decision

In baptism, God calls us from darkness to his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore I ask:

Do you turn to Christ?

I do.

Do you then renounce the devil and all his works?

I do, by God's help.

Will you obey and serve Christ? I will, by God's help.

The priest says to the whole congregation: You have heard these our brothers and sisters respond to Christ. Will you support them in this calling?

The congregation answers:

We will support them.

You are invited to sit and reflect upon this hymn which Charles is going to play whilst the font is prepared for Emilie's baptism and her big sister Annabelle pours the water into the font.

The Baptism

The priest, Emilie Grace, her family and godparents gather at the font and the priest begins the thanksgiving prayer.



Praise God who made heaven and earth.

Who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

[Shortened version of the Blessing of the Water]

We thank you, almighty God, for the gift of water to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life, and we thank you for the water of baptism.

Now sanctify this water that, by the power of your Holy Spirit, she may be cleansed from sin and born again. Renewed in your image, may she walk by the light of faith and continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord; to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be all honour and glory, now and for ever. *Amen*.

The priest asks the parents and godparents:

Do you believe and accept the

Christian faith into which Emilie

Grace is to be baptized?

I do.

The priest addresses the whole congregation:

Brothers and sisters, I ask you to
profess, together with these
candidates the faith of the Church.

[Using a shortened version of the Apostle's Creed in auestion-and-answer form.]

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord.

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life. Amen.

The priest baptizes by pouring water over Emilie Grace saying:

Emilie Grace, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen*.

The priest makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of Emilie Grace, saying:
Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of the cross.



Live as a disciple of Christ, fight the good fight, finish the race, keep the faith

Confess Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, look for his coming in glory.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. Amen.

The priest continues:

God has called you into his Church.

The congregation joins the priest, saying: We therefore receive and welcome you as a member with us of the body of Christ, as a child of the one heavenly Father, and as an inheritor of the kingdom of God.

Presentation of Bible and Candle

The Churchwardens, on behalf of the parish, present Emilie with a Children's Bible and a lit candle. The Bible is to help her to learn more about God and his Son Jesus Christ and to grow in her faith, and the candle symbolises the light of Christ, which has been passed down through the centuries and which is today extended to Emilie, that she may shine forth the light of Christ throughout her life.

(Please feel free to stand, sit or kneel) Blessed are you, Father, the creator and sustainer of all things; you made us in your own image; male and female you created us; even when we turned away from you, you never ceased to care for us, but in your love and mercy you freed us from the slavery of sin, giving your only begotten Son to become man and suffer death on the cross to redeem us; he made there the one complete and allsufficient sacrifice for the sins of the whole world: he instituted, and in his holy Gospel commanded us to continue, a perpetual memory of his precious death until he comes again:

On the night that he was betrayed he took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, Take, eat, this

is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup; and when he had given thanks to you, he gave it to them, saying, Drink this, all of you, for this is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Therefore, Father, with this bread and this cup we do as Christ your Son commanded:

we remember his passion and death, we celebrate his resurrection and ascension, and we look for the coming of his kingdom.

Accept through him, our great high priest, this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; and as we eat and drink these holy gifts, grant by the power of the life-giving Spirit that we may be made one in your holy Church and partakers of the body and blood of your Son, that he may dwell in us and we in him:

Through the same Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom, with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, Almighty Father, for ever and ever. Amen.

The bread which we break is a sharing in the body of Christ.


We being many are one body, for we all share in the one bread.

No PJ's Autumn Fair this year

Update on COVID-19 Restrictions

Dear all,

The Archbishop of Dublin received clarification from the Department of An Taoiseach with relation to Religious Ceremonies, and his secretary forwarded it to clergy today. Please see text in blue below.

As social distancing is still in force, the increase to 50% of venue capacity is subject to that, and therefore, the numbers that we are able to accommodate in either of our churches remains the same. Hopefully, the lifting of further restrictions, which the government's roadmap intends to happen on 22nd October 2021, will enable us to make some progress. However, the priority is people's safety and wellbeing.

This clarifies that services can proceed with <u>up to</u> 50% capacity subject to appropriate protective measures (social distancing, hand sanitising, masks etc) from **6**th **September**.

Please also note that as no updates in relation to singing have been received the following guidance from the HPSC still applies Link
