<u>Face Masks</u>

Contact Tracing

<u>Greeting</u>

Grace, mercy and peace from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ be with you all **and also with you**.

Hymn No. 461 (Carlisle)

[Verses 1-3] For all thy saints, O Lord, who strove in thee to live, who followed thee, obeyed, adored, our grateful hymn receive.

For all thy saints, O Lord, accept our thankful cry, who counted thee their great reward, and strove in thee to die.

They all, in life and death, with thee their Lord in view, learned from thy Holy Spirit's breath to suffer and to do.

<u>The Introduction to Baptism</u> Our Lord Jesus Christ has told us that to enter the kingdom of heaven

we must be born again of water and the Spirit,

and he has given us baptism as the sign and seal of this new birth. Here we are washed by the Holy

Spirit and made clean.

Here we are clothed with Christ, dying to sin that we may live his risen life.

O God our Creator, we thank you for the gift of this precious child Zoe; pure and innocent.

We now turn to you, to ask you to take from us those things that on our lives' journeys, have tarnished our purity and shattered our innocence.

[Silence as we bring to mind those things for which we desire God's forgiveness.]

Almighty God,

who forgives all who truly repent, have mercy on you,

pardon and deliver you from all your sins,

confirm and strengthen you in all goodness,

and keep you in eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen.*

<u>The Collect of the 3rd Sunday</u> <u>before Advent</u>

Almighty Father,

whose will is to restore all things in your beloved Son, the king of all: govern the hearts and minds of those in authority,

and bring the families of the nations, divided and torn apart by the ravages of sin,

to be subject to his just and gentle rule;

who is alive and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit,

one God, now and for ever. Amen.

The Collect for All Saints' Day

Almighty God,

you have knit together your elect in one communion and fellowship in the mystical body of your Son Christ our Lord:

grant us grace so to follow your blessed saints

in all virtuous and godly living that we may come to those inexpressible joys that you have prepared for those who truly love you; through Jesus Christ our Lord. *Amen*.

[Verses 4-5] Thine earthly members fit to join thy saints above, in one communion ever knit, one fellowship of love.

Jesu, thy name we bless, and humbly pray that we may follow them in holiness, and live and die in thee.

THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

The First Reading - Mark 10: 13-

16

The first reading is from the gospel according to Mark, chapter 10, beginning at verse 13.

People were bringing little children to him in order that he might touch them; and the disciples spoke sternly to them. ¹⁴But when Jesus saw this, he was indignant and said to them, 'Let the little children come to me; do not stop them; for it is to such as these that the kingdom of God belongs. ¹⁵Truly I tell you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God as a little child will never enter it.' ¹⁶And he took them up in his arms, laid his hands on them, and blessed them.

This is the Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.



<u>The Gradual Hymn - No. 530 (Ubi</u> <u>caritas et amor)</u>

[The refrain only, is sung 3 times]

Ubi caritas et amor, Ubi caritas Deus ibi est.

[Where charity (i.e. 'loving-kindness' and love are found, God himself is there.]

The Holy Gospel - Mark 12: 38-44

Hear the Gospel of our Saviour Christ, according to Mark, chapter 12, beginning at verse 38.

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

38 As he taught, he said, 'Beware of the scribes, who like to walk around in long robes, and to be greeted with respect in the market-places, ³⁹ and to have the best seats in the synagogues and places of honour at banguets! ⁴⁰They devour widows' houses and for the sake of appearance say long prayers. They will receive the greater condemnation." 41 He sat down opposite the treasury, and watched the crowd putting money into the treasury. Many rich people put in large sums. ⁴²A poor widow came and put in two small copper coins, which are worth a penny. ⁴³Then he called his disciples and said to them, 'Truly I tell you, this poor widow has put in more than all those who are contributing to the treasury. ⁴⁴For all of them have contributed out of their abundance: but she out of her poverty has put in everything she had, all she had to live on.'

This is the Gospel of the Lord. Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

[Verse 1] Will you come and follow me if I but call your name? Will you go where you don't know and never be the same? Will you let my love be shown, will you let my name be known, will you let my life be grown in you and you in me?

The Sermon

The Presentation

We welcome this child who comes to be baptized. I invite her sponsors to present her now.

Sponsors:

We present Zoe Elizabeth Burdett Irvine to be baptized.

Parents and godparents, will you accept the responsibilities placed upon you in bringing Zoe Elizabeth Burdett for baptism and answer on her behalf? By your own prayers and example, by your teaching and love, will you encourage her in the life and faith of the Christian Community? With the help of God, we will.

In baptism this child begins her journey of faith. You speak for her today. Will you care for her and help her to take her place within the life and worship of Christ's Church? With the help of God, we will.

The Decision

In baptism, God calls us from darkness to his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore I ask:

Do you turn to Christ? *I do*.

Do you then renounce the devil and all his works? I do, by God's help.

Will you obey and serve Christ? I will, by God's help.

The priest says to the whole congregation: You have heard these our brothers and sisters respond to Christ. Will you support them in this calling?

The congregation answers: We will support them.

You are invited to sit and reflect upon this hymn which Charles is going to play whilst the font is prepared for Zoe's baptism and her big brother Max pours the water into the font.

Hymn No. 605 (Kelvingrove)

[Verses 2-3] Will you leave your self behind if I but call your name? Will you care for cruel and kind and never be the same? Will you risk the hostile stare Should your life attract or scare? Will you let me answer prayer in you and you in me?

Will you let the blinded see if I but call your name? Will you set the prisoners free and never be the same? Will you kiss the leper clean, and do such as this unseen, and admit to what I mean in you and you in me?

<u>The Baptism</u>

The priest, Zoe Grace, her family and godparents gather at the font and the priest begins the thanksgiving prayer.



Praise God who made heaven and earth.

Who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

[Shortened version of the Blessing of the Water]

We thank you, almighty God, for the gift of water to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life, and we thank you for the water of baptism.

Now sanctify this water that, by the power of your Holy Spirit, she may be cleansed from sin and born again. Renewed in your image, may she walk by the light of faith and continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord; to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be all honour and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The priest asks the parents and godparents: Do you believe and accept the Christian faith into which Zoe Elizabeth Burdett is to be baptized? I do.

The priest addresses the whole congregation: Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess, together with these candidates the faith of the Church.

[Using a shortened version of the Apostle's Creed in question-and-answer form.]

Do you believe and trust in God the Father? I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. Do you believe and trust in God the Son?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord.

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit? I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life. Amen.

The priest baptizes by pouring water over Zoe Elizabeth Burdett saying: Zoe Elizabeth Burdett, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen*.

The priest makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of Zoe Elizabeth Burdett, saying: Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of the cross.



Live as a disciple of Christ, fight the good fight, finish the race, keep the faith.

Confess Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, look for his coming in glory. May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. **Amen**.

The priest continues:

God has called you into his Church.

The congregation joins the priest, saying:

We therefore receive and welcome you as a member with us of the body of Christ, as a child of the one heavenly Father, and as an inheritor of the kingdom of God.

Presentation of Bible and Candle

The Churchwardens, on behalf of the parish, present Zoe with a Children's Bible and a lit candle. The Bible is to help her to learn more about God and his Son Jesus Christ and to grow in her faith, and the candle symbolises the light of Christ, which has been passed down through the centuries and which is today extended to Zoe, that she may shine forth the light of Christ throughout her life.

THE MINISTRY OF THE SACRAMENT

Christ, our passover has been sacrificed for us, therefore let us celebrate the feast.

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might. Heaven and earth are full of your glory.

Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest!

(Please feel free to stand, sit or kneel)

Blessed are you, Father, the creator and sustainer of all things; you made us in your own image; male and female you created us; even when we turned away from you, you never ceased to care for us, but in your love and mercy you freed us from the slavery of sin, giving your only begotten Son to become man and suffer death on the cross to redeem us; he made there the one complete and allsufficient sacrifice for the sins of the whole world: he instituted, and in his holy Gospel commanded us to continue, a perpetual memory of his precious death until he comes again:

On the night that he was betrayed he took bread; and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying, Take, eat, this is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.

In the same way, after supper he took the cup; and when he had given thanks to you, he gave it to them, saying, Drink this, all of you, for this is my blood of the new covenant which is shed for you and for many for the forgiveness of sins. Do this, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me.

Therefore, Father, with this bread and this cup we do as Christ your Son commanded:

we remember his passion and death, we celebrate his resurrection and ascension, and we look for the coming of his kingdom.

Accept through him, our great high priest, this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; and as we eat and drink these holy gifts, grant by the power of the life-giving Spirit that we may be made one in your holy Church and partakers of the body and blood of your Son, that he may dwell in us and we in him:

Through the same Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom, with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, Almighty Father, for ever and ever. Amen.

<u>The Lord's Prayer</u> Our Father, who art in heaven: hallowed be thy name, thy kingdom come, thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, and the power, and the glory for ever and ever. Amen.
