Sorry, Lord.


For the times when we have doubted your love for us, and not been sure of your promise of eternal life.

Hear the Gospel of our Saviour Christ, according to Mark, chapter 16, beginning at verse 1.


Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

Therefore, Father, with this bread and this cup we do as Christ your Son commanded:

we remember his passion and death, we celebrate his resurrection and ascension, and we look for the coming of his kingdom.

Accept through him, our great high priest, this our sacrifice of praise and thanksgiving; and as we eat and drink these holy gifts, grant by the power of the life-giving Spirit that we may be made one in your holy Church and partakers of the body and blood of your Son, that he may dwell in us and we in him:

Through the same Jesus Christ our Lord, by whom, with whom, and in whom, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honour and glory are yours, Almighty Father, for ever and ever. Amen.

- Sheltered housing and nursing care for over 200 elderly people through our sister companies, the Brabazon Trust and St John's House


