The changes to restrictions, announced on Friday 3rd December 2021, do not affect church services.

<u>Face Masks</u>

Two candles are lit on the Advent Wreath.

The candles on our Advent Wreath will remind us of the story of how, through the years, through different people, and finally in Jesus Christ, God's Kingdom comes on earth. The first candle is to remind us of the patriarchs (the leaders God sent before Jesus). The second candle is to remind us of the prophets, those who brought God's message to the world in which they lived and who said what they thought about what was really going on in the world, even when they were afraid.

They believed in God during dark days, and looked forward to the coming of Christ.

There are people like that today too, who are confronting justice and restoring the dream of a world of freedom and peace. God, as we wait for your promise, give light, give hope.

Living God, we thank you for faithful people of every age.

We pray that we, too, may have faith, in spite of the darkness of our

times, and may look for the coming of Jesus into our world. Amen.
