coin used for the tax.' And they

whose title?' <sup>21</sup>They answered, 'The  
emperor's.' Then he said to them, 'Give  
therefore to the emperor the things  
that are the emperor's, and to God  
the things that are God's.' <sup>22</sup>When  
they heard this, they were amazed;  
and they left him and went away.

Father.*

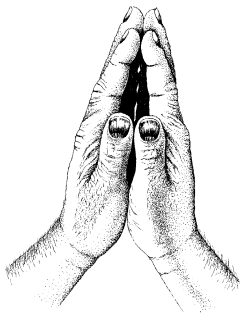
*He will come again to judge the
