
A lasting gift Jesus gave his own: to share his bread, his loving cup. Whatever burdens may bow us down, he by his Cross shall lift us up.

Update on COVID-19 Restrictions

Dear all,

The Archbishop of Dublin received clarification from the Department of An Taoiseach with relation to Religious

Ceremonies, and his secretary forwarded it to clergy today. Please see text in blue below.

As social distancing is still in force, the increase to 50% of venue capacity is subject to that, and therefore, the numbers that we are able to accommodate in either of our churches remains the same. Hopefully, the lifting of further restrictions, which the government's roadmap intends to happen on 22nd October 2021, will enable us to make some progress. However, the priority is people's safety and wellbeing.

This clarifies that services can proceed with <u>up to</u> 50% capacity subject to appropriate protective measures (social distancing, hand sanitising, masks etc) from **6**th **September**.

Please also note that as no updates in relation to singing have been received the following guidance from the HPSC still applies <u>Link</u>

'Indoor congregational singing should be avoided due to the increased risk of COVID-19 transmission to other people present at the service. Therefore, it is important that the congregation is made aware that they should not sing along with the singers or other instrumental music.'
