Hear the Gospel of our Saviour Christ, according to Mark, chapter 4, beginning at verse 35.

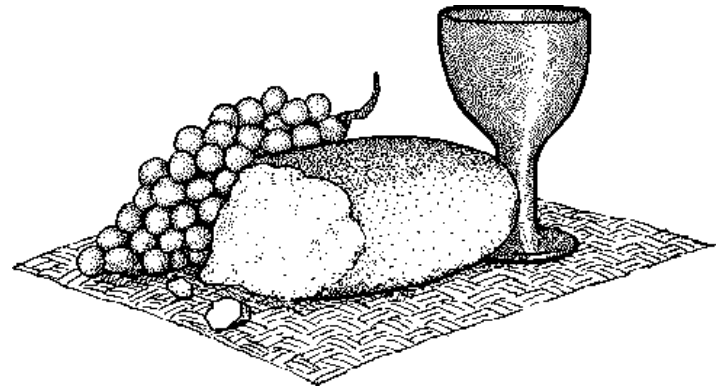

As we eat and drink these holy gifts make us, who know our need of grace, one in Christ, our risen Lord.

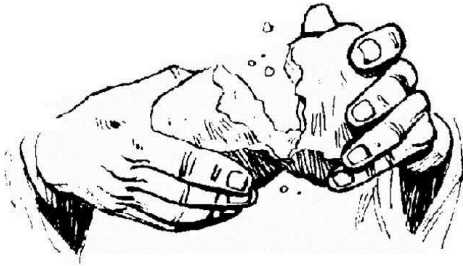
