We have now received updated guidelines from the government which confirms that very little has changed for places of religious worship; appropriate social distancing is required, masks are to be worn, hard surfaces sanitised, limitations on singing, etc.

Face Masks

As per government guidelines, please wear a face covering in church. Those who are leading/reading at the service may remove their face covering whilst they are leading/reading but must observe socialdistancing whilst doing so.

Contact Tracing

We are obliged to get the contact details of everyone who attends this service. These will only be used in the event of someone attending the service being diagnosed with Covid-19, in which event, they will be passed to the health authorities for Contact Tracing purposes. Please complete the form which is available at the church doors and drop into the box provided. If they are not required for Contact Tracing purposes, they will be destroyed after 28 days.

<u>Singing</u>

We are also still awaiting an update on COVID-19 restrictions with regard to congregational singing. Over the past few weeks, there has been some 'musical muttering into masks'! The organist, is going to play the tune of the hymns chosen for this service and I invite you to reflect upon the words which have been included in this service sheet as you listen to the music.

(Silence)


Almighty God, our heavenly Father, we have sinned in thought and word and deed,
