

Gillian and a number of others who are doing various challenges have done thirty-two days! ... so far, so good!

We are in difficult times, and for many, this third lockdown has been, and is, the hardest. In Lent 2021, I am suggesting that rather than giving things up, that we could pull together as a parochial group for our mental, spiritual, emotional and physical wellbeing and health, whilst at the same time raising funds for three charities.

The idea is to try and do 5km a day, whether you walk it, cycle it or run it. If 5km is too much, set yourself a lower target; if it is too easy, set a higher one! Or you can set yourself whatever challenge works for you: learning the 'Jerusalema' and

learning the 'Jerusalema' and dancing it every day in Lent; learning sign language... it's up to you, but do something that benefits you

physically, mentally, emotionally and spiritually, this Lent.

The money raised will be divided equally between the three charities.

last year and we will not be able to
have it this year. Please note that
we will be having a Daffodil Service
as part of our Palm Sunday Service
on Sunday 28th March 2021.
