11 Thus says the LORD,

¹² I made the earth, and created humankind upon it; it was my hands that stretched out the heavens. and I commanded all their host. 13 I have aroused Cyrus in righteousness, and I will make all his paths straight; he shall build my city and set my exiles free, not for price or reward, says the LORD of hosts. 18 For thus says the LORD, who created the heavens (he is God!), who formed the earth and made it (he established it: he did not create it a chaos, he formed it to be inhabited!): I am the LORD, and there is no other. ¹⁹ I did not speak in secret, in a land of darkness: I did not say to the offspring of Jacob. 
