We are delighted that you are joining with us in St Philip and St James' Church this morning as we gather to celebrate 200 years of worship in this church, and we are particularly delighted that the Archbishop of Armagh, The Most Rev. John McDowell, is the special preacher, and that the Archbishop of Dublin, the Most Rev. Michael Jackson, is presiding at this service. Today is a momentous occasion in the life of this community of faith.

On Sunday 16th May 1824, the newly completed church, dedicated to St Philip and St James, was consecrated by The Most Rev. William Magee, Archbishop of Dublin.

Three years previously, the Parish of Booterstown had been formed when the formal deeds for the Parish of Booterstown, which was 'carved out' of the Parish of Donnybrook, were registered on 29th June 1821. Traditionally, the parish has marked the anniversaries of the foundation of the parish but restrictions due to the COVID pandemic limited our celebrations three years ago.

Today, we do not just give thanks for the church as a building; we give thanks for the church as a community of people, the Body of Christ; for those whose faith and vision saw the foundation of the parish and the building of this church; for those who have been a part of this parish community over the past 203 years and for those whose presence and prayers have hallowed the walls and fabric of this church for 200 years and made it a house of prayer.

Over the past number of years, the parish has undertaken a number of projects in the church: replacing the entire roof, installing a new heating system, an enhanced sound system, facilities to live-stream services, alternations to make the church more wheelchair-friendly and accessible for those with mobility challenges, a more flexible seating arrangement to facilitate a great variety of worship, activities and hospitality. All has been done for the future, for this parish and wider community, to be a place of greater inclusion and accessibility.

Whilst we give thanks this morning for all that has been in the past, we also come to pray for the future, that we would faithfully reflect God as revealed by Christ, that we would be a community of warm welcome and inclusion so that all who come get an experience of God's love and compassion.

THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

The First Reading - Acts 2: 2-21

The first reading is from the Acts of the Apostles, chapter 2, beginning at verse 2.

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. ²And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. ⁴All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

5 Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. ⁶And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. ⁷Amazed and astonished, they asked, 'Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? ⁹Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, ¹¹Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God's deeds of power.' ¹²All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, 'What does this mean?' ¹³But others sneered and said, 'They are filled with new wine.'

14 But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them: 'Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. ¹⁵Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o'clock in the morning. ¹⁶No, this is what was spoken through the prophet

Joel:

- ¹⁷ "In the last days it will be, God declares, that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh, and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, and your young men shall see visions, and your old men shall dream dreams.
- ¹⁸ Even upon my slaves, both men and women, in those days I will pour out my Spirit; and they shall prophesy.
- ¹⁹ And I will show portents in the heaven above and signs on the earth below, blood, and fire, and smoky mist.
- ²⁰ The sun shall be turned to darkness and the moon to blood, before the coming of the Lord's great and glorious day.
- ²¹ Then everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be saved."

The Epistle – Romans 8: 22-27

The epistle is from the letter of Saint Paul to the Romans, chapter 8, beginning at verse 22.

²²We know that the whole creation has been groaning in labour pains until now; ²³and not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the first fruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly while we wait for adoption, the redemption of our bodies. ²⁴For in hope we were saved. Now hope that is seen is not hope. For who hopes for what is seen? ²⁵But if we hope for what we do not see, we wait for it with patience.

26 Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. ²⁷And God, who searches the heart, knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God.

The Holy Gospel - John 15: 26-27, 16:4b-15

Hear the Gospel of our Saviour Christ, according to John, chapters 15 and 16, beginning at verse 26 of chapter 15.

Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.

26 'When the Advocate comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of truth who comes from the Father, he will testify on my behalf. ²⁷You also are to testify because you have been with me from the beginning. ⁴But I have said these things to you so that when their hour comes you may remember that I told you about them.

'I did not say these things to you from the beginning, because I was with you. ⁵But now I am going to him who sent me; yet none of you asks me, "Where are you going?" ⁶But because I have said these things to you, sorrow has filled your hearts. ⁷Nevertheless, I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Advocate will not come to you; but if I go, I will send him to you. ⁸And when he comes, he will prove the world wrong about sin and righteousness and judgement: ⁹about sin, because they do not believe in me; ¹⁰about righteousness, because I am going to the Father and you will see me no longer; ¹¹about judgement, because the ruler of this world has been condemned.

12 'I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. ¹³When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth; for he will not speak on his own, but will speak whatever he hears, and he will declare to you the things that are to come. ¹⁴He will glorify me, because he will take what is mine and declare it to you. ¹⁵All that the Father has is mine. For this reason I said that he will take what is mine and declare it to you.

The Nicene Creed

We believe in one God, the Father, the Almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all that is, seen and unseen.

The Taking of the Bread and Wine

Christ, our passover has been sacrificed for us, therefore let us celebrate the feast.

As we eat and drink these holy gifts make us, who know our need of grace, one in Christ, our risen Lord.
