The second candle is to remind us of the prophets, those who brought God's message to the world in which they lived and who said what they thought about what was really going on in the world, even when they were afraid.

There are people like that today too, who are confronting justice and restoring the dream of a world of freedom and peace.

God, as we wait for your promise, give light, give hope.

Living God,

## The Old Testament Reading - Isaiah 40: 1-11

The Old Testament Reading is from the book of the prophet Isaiah, chapter 40, beginning at verse 1.

40 Comfort, O comfort my people, says your God.

<sup>2</sup> Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and cry to her that she has served her term, that her penalty is paid, that she has received from the LORD's hand

double for all her sins.

<sup>3</sup> A voice cries out:

'In the wilderness prepare the way of the LORD,

make straight in the desert a highway for our God.

<sup>4</sup> Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low;

the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain.

<sup>5</sup> Then the glory of the LORD shall be revealed,

and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the LORD has spoken.'

<sup>6</sup> A voice says, 'Cry out!' And I said, 'What shall I cry?' All people are grass, their constancy is like the flower of the field.

## The New Testament Reading - Mark 1: 1-8

The New Testament Reading is from the gospel according to St Mark, chapter 1, beginning at verse 1.

The beginning of the good news of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.

As it is written in the prophet Isaiah, 'See, I am sending my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way;

3the voice of one crying out in the wilderness:

"Prepare the way of the Lord, make his paths straight"', <sup>4</sup>John the baptizer appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. <sup>5</sup>And people from the whole Judean countryside and all the people of Jerusalem were going out to him, and were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins. 6 Now John was clothed with camel's hair, with a leather belt around his waist, and he ate locusts and wild honey. <sup>7</sup>He proclaimed, 'The one who is more powerful than I is coming after me; I am not worthy to stoop down and untie the thong of his sandals. 8I have baptized you with water; but he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit.'
