St Paul says, 'Be imitators of God; love as Christ loved; do not grieve the Holy Spirit; put away all anger and bitterness, all slander and malice.'

we thank you for the gift of these precious children India, Theodore and Renée; pure and innocent.

We now think of the things that we have done, said or thought or not done that have tarnished our purity and shattered our innocence.

You made us to be one family, yet we have divided humanity.

We have labelled people and put them into boxes in our minds and in our hearts.

Lord, have mercy. Lord, have mercy.

You were born a Jew to reconcile all people, yet we have brought disharmony amongst races. Forgive us when we have been too apathetic or too afraid to speak out. Christ, have mercy. **Christ, have mercy.** You rejoice in our differences, yet we make them a cause of enmity. Give us the courage and generosity of heart to embrace difference, to celebrate diversity and to be enriched by variety. Lord, have mercy.

Lord, have mercy.

May God who loved the world so much that he sent his Son to be our Saviour forgive us our sins and make us holy to serve him in the world, through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

<u>The Collect of the 3rd Sunday after</u> the Epiphany

Almighty God,

whose Son revealed in signs and miracles the wonder of your saving presence:

The Collect for Baptism

At our Lord's baptism in the river Jordan, God showed himself to all who have eyes to see and ears to hear. The Father spoke from heaven, the Spirit descended as a dove and Jesus was anointed with power from on high. For us baptism is the door of faith, through which we enter the Kingdom of Heaven.

As children of God, we are adopted as his sons and daughters, and called to proclaim the wonders of him who called us out of darkness into his marvellous light. *Amen*.

THE MINISTRY OF THE WORD

<u>The First Reading - Saint Matthew</u> <u>4: 18–23</u>

The first reading is from the Gospel according to Saint Matthew, chapter 4, beginning at verse 18.

18 As he walked by the Sea of Galilee, he saw two brothers, Simon, who is called Peter, and Andrew his brother, casting a net into the lake for they were fishermen. ¹⁹And he said to them, 'Follow me, and I will make you fish for people.' ²⁰Immediately they left their nets and followed him. ²¹As he went from there, he saw two other brothers, James son of Zebedee and his brother John, in the boat with their father Zebedee, mending their nets, and he called them. ²²Immediately they left the

boat and their father, and followed him.

23 Jesus went throughout Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the good news of the kingdom and curing every disease and every sickness among the people.

But when Jesus saw it he was indignant, and said to them, "Let the children come to me, do not hinder them; for to such belongs the kingdom of God. Truly, I say to you, whoever does not receive the kingdom of God like a child shall not enter it." And he took them in his arms and blessed them, laying his hands upon them.

The Sermon

The Presentation

We welcome these children who come to be baptized. I invite their sponsors to present them now.

Parents and godparents:

We present India Gabrielle Mitchell, Theodore William Mitchell and Renée Carol Mitchell to be baptized.

Parents and godparents, will you accept the responsibilities placed upon you in bringing India Gabrielle, Theodore William and Renée Carol for baptism and answer on their behalf? By your own prayers and example, by your teaching and love, will you encourage them in the life and faith of the Christian Community? With the help of God, we will.

In baptism these children begin their journey of faith. You speak for them today. Will you care for them and help them to take their place within the life and worship of Christ's Church?

With the help of God, we will.

The Decision

In baptism, God calls us from darkness to his marvellous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with him.

Therefore I ask:

Do you turn to Christ? I do.

Do you then renounce the devil and all his works?

I do, by God's help.

Will you obey and serve Christ? I will, by God's help.

The priest says to the whole congregation: You have heard these our brothers and sisters respond to Christ. Will you support them in this calling?

The congregation answers: We will support them.

<u>The Baptism</u> Water is poured into the font.



Praise God who made heaven and earth.

Who keeps his promise for ever.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

[Shortened version of the Blessing of the Water]

We thank you, almighty God, for the gift of water to sustain, refresh and cleanse all life, and we thank you for the water of baptism.

Now sanctify this water that, by the power of your Holy Spirit, they may be cleansed from sin and born again. Renewed in your image, may they walk by the light of faith and continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Lord; to whom with you and the Holy Spirit be all honour and glory, now and for ever. **Amen.**

The priest asks the parents and godparents: Do you believe and accept the Christian faith into which Renée, Theodore and India, are to be baptized? I do.

The priest addresses the whole congregation: Brothers and sisters, I ask you to profess, together with these candidates the faith of the Church.

[Using a shortened version of the Apostle's Creed in question-and-answer form.]

Do you believe and trust in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty,

creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe and trust in God the Son? I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord.

Do you believe and trust in God the Holy Spirit? I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver of life. Amen.



The priest baptizes by pouring water over India, saying:

India Gabrielle, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen.*

The priest makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of India, saying:

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of the cross.

The priest baptizes by pouring water over Teddy, saying:

Theodore William, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen.*

The priest makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of Teddy, saying:

Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of the cross.

The priest baptizes by pouring water over Renée, saying:

Renée Carol, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. *Amen*.

The priest makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of Renée, saying: Christ claims you for his own. Receive the sign of the cross.

The priest then prays for India, Teddy and Renée, saying:

Live as disciples of Christ, fight the good fight, finish the race, keep the faith.

Confess Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, look for his coming in glory.

May almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness, restore in you the image of his glory, and lead you in the light and obedience of Christ. *Amen*. The priest continues:

God has called you into his Church.

The congregation joins the priest, saying:

We therefore receive and welcome you

as members with us of the body of Christ.

as children of the one heavenly Father.

and as inheritors of the kingdom of God.

Renée, Teddy and India, are presented with gifts from the Parish of Children's Bibles and lit candles. The Bible is to help them to learn more about God and his Son Jesus Christ and to grow in their faith, and the candle symbolises the light of Christ, which has been passed down through the centuries and which is today extended to Teddy, Renée and India, that they may shine forth the light of Christ throughout their lives.
